



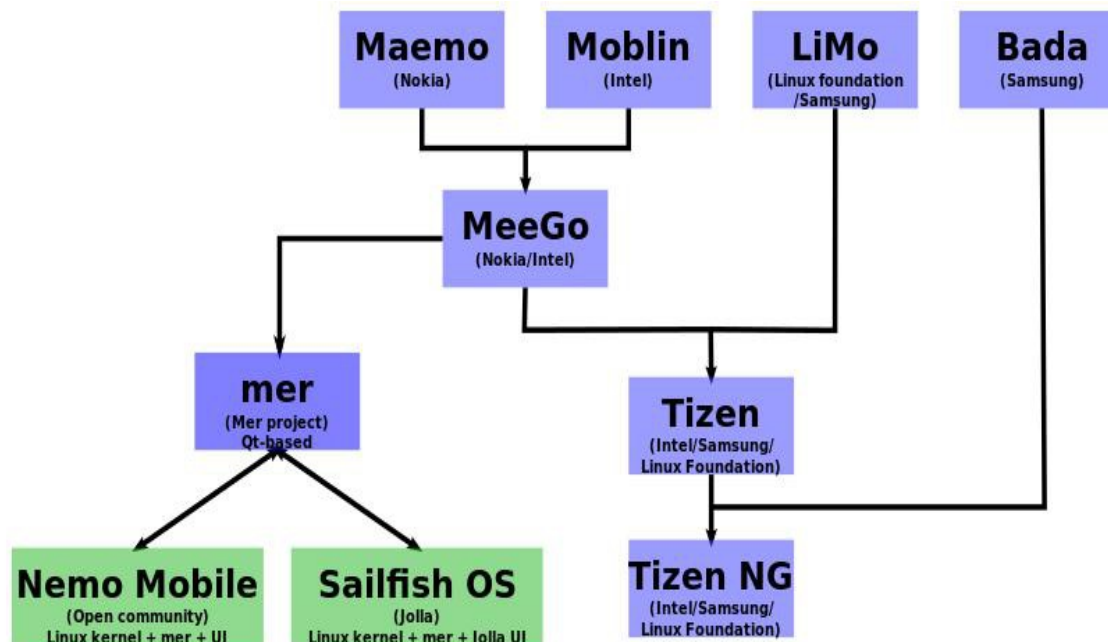

jolla

- Finish company with headquarters in Helsinki
- Founded in Marts 2011
- ~ 60 developers, many former employees of Nokia
- Core focus is Linux based smart devices

The history

- 2009: Nokia N900 running Maemo Linux launched
- 2011: Nokia N9 running MeeGo Linux launched
- 2011: Developers of MeeGo left the company and formed Jolla with the goal making a Linux-based OS for mobile devices
- 2013: The first Jolla Phone running Sailfish OS was launched



Sailfish

- Build upon the open MeeGo-fork called Mer Project
- Uses the Linux kernel, systemd, wayland and Qt
- Unique swipe and gesture based user interface
- Runs native apps written in Qt or HTML5, but can also run most Android apps flawlessly
- Easily portable to Android devices due to libhybris*
- Updates released every second month

The Jolla Phone



- Released in November 2013
- Available for online purchase from EU, Norway and Switzerland and retail stores in Finland and Estonia
- 4.5 in IPS qHD (540×960) "Estrade" display
- Qualcomm Snapdragon 400 1.4 GHz dual-core processor (8930AA)
- GSM/3G/4G LTE connection
- 16 GB of storage memory
- microSD support
- 8 MPix AF camera, back
- 2 MPix camera, front
- 2100 mAh user-replaceable battery
- **"The Other Half"**
- Gesture-based Sailfish OS
- Buttonless display, gesture navigation
- **Unlocked boot loader**
- **Root and ssh access through developer mode**

- Swapable back covers
- Extend phone features
- NFG tag supported

Future plans

- Major software update planned for September
- Jolla plans to launch in Asian markets (eg China and India) in fall 2014
- No plans to enter US in the near future, do avoid dealing “with religious patent issues”.
- Jolla Launcher for Android to be released as public beta in August *
- Make it easier to flash Sailfish OS on an Android device
- Partner with hardware vendors and focus more on software
- The next Jolla phone will be released “no later than 2015”

* A simple launcher to easily give people a feeling of Sailfish OS without modifying their Android device
